- The Council hired Tidal Bay Consulting to develop a strawman for a LE program through stakeholder engagement.

Groundfish stocks/areas

- What groundfish stocks should be included in a limited entry program?
- Where should limited entry vessels be permitted to fish? SNE, GB, GOM
- Would limited entry vessels be permitted to fish in special access areas?



Template – Permits/Vessels

How is the privilege held

- Who or what would the limited entry permit be assigned to?
 - vessel, vessel owner/business owner
- Should there be an owner/operator clause?
- Should a vessel be allowed to fish under a commercial limited access permit while holding a recreational limited entry permit?
 - Northeast multispecies



Permits

- Should there be different categories of permits?
 - Incidental, part-time, full-time, or based on passenger capacity
- Should permits be transferable?
 - If yes, should they be separate from other limited access permits held by a vessel?
- If transferable, should there be any limits?
 - Same vessel passenger capacity, family, employees, geographic area, etc.



Permits

- How should permit value be determined?
 - Public auction, private sale, other.
- What should occur if a permit is surrendered to NOAA?
 - Permit bank, waitlist, public sale/auction
- Should latent effort be monitored and considered?



Vessel upgrade restrictions

- Should vessel upgrade restrictions be considered?
- If so, what restrictions should apply?
 - Passenger capacity
 - Vessel length
 - Engine horsepower
 - Gross tonnage
 - Other



Template - Eligibility

Eligibility – Control Date

- Should a control date be used?
- What control date should apply?
 - Existing (March 19, 2018) or refresh date?
- What criteria should accompany the control date?
 - None, minimum eligibility or should different conditions apply before/after the date?
- Should there be any exceptions to the control date?



Eligibility – History

- What other criteria should eligibility be based on?
 - Catch history pounds landed over qualifying years
 - Effort number of trips over qualifying years
 - Catch history + effort
 - Passengers number of passengers over qualifying years
 - Other?
- How would changes in management be considered in the qualifying years for catch history and/or effort?



Eligibility – Other Criteria

- Who or what should fishing history be based on?
 - Permit (vessel), permit holder (owner), other.
- Should history from a commercial limited access groundfish permit contribute towards eligibility?



Eligibility – Certifications

- Should a USCG Certificate of Inspection (COI) be considered in determining eligibility?
- Should USCG captain's licensing requirements be considered in determining eligibility?
- Should any other training criteria be considered?



Template – New Entrants

New Entrants

- How should new entrants be allowed into the fishery?
 - Waitlist, apprenticeship program, permit bank, other.
- How should cost/affordability be considered for new entrants?
 - Min/max cost criteria, free market, subsidize permits
- Should eligibility criteria recognize active industry participants (e.g., hired captains and crew)?



New Entrants

 Should the total number of permits available be correlated with stock assessments and annual catch limits (ACLs)?



Management and Reporting

Management Measures

- How should management measures be applied to vessels in a limited entry program?
 - Apply to all vessels, separate measures for party and charter vessels, other.
- Should there be separate allocations by mode?
 - For-hire vessels would have an overall % of the recreational sub-ACL, and private vessels would have an overall %

Reporting and Monitoring

- What reporting requirements should apply?
 - Existing VTR requirements, additional requirements, other
- Should performance of the limited entry program be monitored and evaluated?
 - If so, how often and what agency would coordinate?
- Should a sunset clause be established?
 - If so, how many years?
